Crowe Academy is a summer educational program aimed at those who would like to experience a fulfilling weekend on the Hanover campus, enjoying the intellectual and cultural offerings of the College. Named after the founder of Hanover College, John Finley Crowe, Crowe Academy is a component of the Center for Free Inquiry® at Hanover College, which is an interdisciplinary institute dedicated to exploring fundamental and enduring issues through the lens of the liberal arts. CFI, established in 1997, addresses itself to a broad audience and seeks to advance knowledge and shape debate through lectures, symposia, and publications.

Since its founding in 1827, Hanover College has been committed to providing a true liberal arts education. Hanover College offers 28 major areas of study as well as the opportunity for students to self-design their own major. Hanover also offers specialized Centers of

Excellence including the Center for Business Preparation, the Center for Church Leadership, the Center for Free Inquiry, and the Rivers Institute.

Outside the classroom, students can participate in one of over 50 student organization, 16 NCAA Division III varsity sports, an active fraternity and sorority Greek system, and intramural sports. Students also take advantage of being just outside historic Madison, Indiana, and close to Louisville (45 miles), Cincinnati (70 miles), and Indianapolis (95 miles).

Indiana's oldest private college, Hanover's 650-acre campus is home to approximately 1000 students from across the U.S. and abroad as well as the one-third of Hanover's faculty and staff living on the campus grounds. The College is one of The Princeton Review's Best 361 Colleges and a U.S. News & World Report top 100 national liberal arts college and top 50 "Best Value".

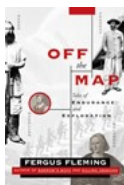
Event Details

Costs: \$350.00 per person (covers costs of course materials, lodging, meals, and instruction). Persons who commute will be charged \$290.00. A nonrefundable deposit of \$75.00 is required by June 1 and the **total registration fee must be paid in full by June 16, 2008.**

Meals: Meals will be served cafeteria-style in the Main Dining Room of the Brown Campus Center.

Housing: On-campus housing is provided with the registration fee. Guests will stay in air-conditioned, two twin-bed rooms. Towels, bed linen, blankets, and pillows will be provided. Please call 812-866-6848 if you have questions.

Free time: Duggan Library and the bookstore will be open Friday afternoon until 4:00. The bookstore will also be open Saturday from 11:30-2:00. Horner Center passes will be available to all participants at no additional cost.

Janice Voss is Lead of the Astronaut Office Payloads Branch at NASA's Johnson Space Center. She received her Ph.D. in Aeronautics/Astronautics from the Massachusetts Institute of Technology. An astronaut since 1991, Dr. Voss has served on five space flights aboard the Shuttle (spending 49 days in space and traveling 18.8 million miles through 779 earth orbits). For three years until November 2007, she was Science Director for the Kepler Mission, a spacecraft that will trail the earth looking for earth-sized planets near distant stars.

Jeffrey C. Brautigam is Associate Professor and Chair of the Department of History at Hanover College. A recipient of a Ph. D. in history from the University of Florida, he has taught European History at the college level for 15 years. The author of *5 Steps to a 5: AP European History* (McGraw-Hill, 2008) and *A Student Introduction to Charles Darwin* (Kendall/Hunt, 1999), Professor Brautigam is a historian who writes for students and general audiences

Daniel P. Murphy is Professor of History and Associate Director of the Center for Free Inquiry at Hanover College. A 1981 alumnus of Hanover College, he earned his Ph.D. from Northwestern University in 1988 and joined the Hanover College faculty that same year. He is the Founding Director of CFI and is currently the program director for CFI's symposium series. Murphy teaches courses in Western Civilization and American History, with a specialization in American military and cultural history. His book *Everything American Revolution* will appear in September.

Pete Worcester is Professor of Geology and Natural Sciences Division Head at Hanover College. Worcester joined the Hanover College Geology Department in 1972. In addition to introductory geology courses, he teaches mineralogy, igneous and metamorphic petrology, and geographic information science. He has taught Hanover's geology field course in New Mexico and Miami (Ohio) University's geology field course in Wyoming.
